Our volunteers deliver a hot, nutritious lunch-time meal to seniors who may have difficulty preparing meals and maintaining optimal nutrition.





This program helps local seniors stay healthy with fresh and nutrious meals delivered right to their door. While we previously received meals from Wentworth Lodge, we have recently switched to **Set The Table** as our hot meal provider due to COVID-19 related safety concerns. We have seen steady growth in meals delivered and clients served during the 2019-20 fiscal year. Alongside a **21% increase in meals delivered**, we have also seen a **6% increase in clients served** going up to **242 clients in total**. On average, our volunteers delivered to approximately **20 clients a month.**


FROZEN MEALS

Delicious, home-style meals are freshly prepared, frozen at our provider's location and available for pick-up or delivery.

Our Frozen Meals program is for seniors may not be able to receive meal delivery during certain times of the day. Through this program, they are able to pick up their meals from our office or have them delivered on Wednesdays. Our Frozen Meals provider continues to be Ina Grafton. We follow their Summer and Winter menus that include seasonal with entrees, desserts and soups

Frozen Meals has also seen strong growth, especially towards the end of the fiscal year as the pandemic became a concern for many seniors. There has been a **31% increase in meals provided,** along with a **3% increase in clients served**.

FOOD ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS


We provided emergency food assistance for 1,207 individuals who reside within Ancaster and also in surrounding rural areas such as Lynden, Jerseyville and West Hamilton.

FOOD BANK

ACS assisted a total of 1,207 people for all Food Assistance Programs from 428 households throughout the year, compared to 1,122 from 380 in 2018. While the number of individuals served has not increased dramatically, there was a 6% increase in households served. There was also a 25% increase in households receiving food cards, leading to a 21% increase in vouchers provided during the fiscal year.



Recently, we increased the size of our Food Bank and purchased a fridge and freezer to store produce, bread, milk and other fresh items.



In September 2019, ACS officially launched Ancaster's first-ever Youth Empowerment Program, **The Net.** This program provides an important platform for youth in the Ancaster community to connect with other youth, plan engaging events and activities, offers leadership opportunities and volunteer experiences, and addresses the important issues and challenges facing youth today.

To ensure the needs of youth were being met, we comprised a Youth Advisory Team of student representatives from various local middle schools and high schools. We began with 18 members and we now have 22 members from schools such as **Frank Panabaker, Ancaster High School, Bishop Tonnos** and **Hillfield Strathallan College.**



SUMMER YOUTH PROGRAMS

SUMMER BABYSITTING COURSE

Our Summer Babysitting Course ran for two week-long sessions in July 2019. Students were given the chance to learn about important topics such as Fire Safety, Water Safety, personal safety and Mental Health awareness. We had 19 students in the first session and 30 students in our second session - in total, there were 49 graduates!



YOUTH EMPLOYMENT SERVICES PROGRAM

ACS also ran our Youth Employment Services (Y.E.S) Program for the months of July and August in 2019. Through this program we matched students with local community members who needed help with jobs such as grass-cutting, lawn-care and babysitting. In total, there were 28 registered employers and 36 registered employees and we were able to successfully match 23 jobs.





INFORMATION, TOURISM & REFERRAL SERVICE

Providing the community with relevant and current information.

ACS has received many calls and visits from community members and those coming from out-of-town regarding general questions, inquries or related tourism information. We also commonly receive calls from residents and clients asking about other social services and organizations in the community for programs that we may not offer, such as mental health supports and medical services.

In addition to calling and in-person visits, we receive information requests through emails and social media messages.





COVID-19 PROGRAMS

The COVID-19 Pandemic escalated at the end of our Fiscal Year. Although some programs were suspended, our office remained open and we continued to provide essential programs. We also created two *new* programs to help seniors during this difficult time.

SHOPPING 4 SENIORS

Volunteers purchase groceries for local seniors and deliver them to their door contactfree. This program was created for seniors with little to no support during COVID-19.

FRIENDLY CALLING

Volunteers will call local senior clients 1-2 times per week for a friendly conversation while simultaneously performing a wellness check.

ENHANCED SAFETY PROTOCOLS

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, ACS has implemented increased cleaning measures in our office and extensive health & safety protocols to better protect our staff, volunteers and clients.

CHRISTMAS ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Providing local families, seniors and individuals who need extra support with Christmas hampers, food and grocery gift cards for the holiday season.

Our Christmas Assistance Program registration opened on September 30th, 2019 and closed on November 26th. Hamper Assembly ran between December 2nd to the 13th **with the help of our incredible volunteers.** Hampers were available for pick-up from December 16th to 20th and if households were not able to come to our office, hamper deliveries took place on December 17th. Good Food Boxes were delivered on December 18th.

We had incredible support from contributors like **Fairway Electric**, who bought a large quantity of food and turkeys, and the **Rotary Club of Ancaster A.M.** who donated \$750 towards 50 Good Food Boxes, \$1000 worth of toys, \$1000 of food from Food Basics and volunteered to set up hampers and deliver good food boxes. We had **102 hamper registrations**, which was a **12% increase** from the previous year. In total, our Christmas Assistance Program served **285 individuals**, including **130 children and 24 seniors. 60%** of these individuals were from Ancaster, while 40% were from West Hamilton and other surrounding areas.


