

BOARD CHAIR STATEMENT



The board of directors of an incorporated, non-profit organization is legally responsible for the governance of the organization. Within that mandate is the expectation that the board will develop, implement and monitor policies that will allow the organization to carry out its work. A board is elected by, and accountable to, its membership. While a board may appoint staff and/or committees to carry out specific work related to its policies, programs and services, the board is ultimately responsible for meeting organizational outcomes.

At Ancaster Community Services, the board of directors is comprised of experienced business and community leaders who are dedicated to providing financial, agency and community oversight and support to ensure that ACS fulfills its commitment to the community and its residents.

ACS serves the diverse community of Ancaster by providing programs, volunteer opportunities, information and resources which enhance the quality of life for all. Despite the challenges presented by the evolving COVID-19 pandemic in the past year, ACS successfully fulfilled its mission in accordance with its values of providing accessible, dependable quality services powered by volunteers who treat clients with dignity and respect.

ACS brings the community together in many ways – directly through its programs for food security, seniors and youth, and also through fundraising events and volunteer connections. There were many highlights and milestones in the past year, including:

- Enhancing food security and nutrition through Meals on Wheels, Frozen Meals, and the Food Bank. Meals on Wheels and Frozen Meals are of particular assistance for providing nutrition to seniors as well as social interaction. The ACS Food Bank also continued to be relied upon by families and individuals in need.
- Safely providing assistance to 321 individuals through the Christmas/Holiday Assistance Program, including 105 hampers to families. This was a collaborative team effort supported by additional volunteers as well as support from the City of Hamilton, the Hamilton Public Library (Ancaster Branch), and the Rotary Club of Ancaster.
- Providing continued support and social contact to vulnerable and isolated individuals through the Friendly Calling Program, with over 300 calls.
- Connecting with youth through The Net. Highlights of The Net's successful program including Santa to a Senior Program, Financial Literacy programming in partnership with the Canada Revenue Agency and RBS, March Reading Madness Program, At Home Virtual Engagement Challenges, and Virtual Bi-Monthly coffee house.

This is just a few of the ways that ACS supported the community in the past year, all while keeping staff, volunteers, and community members safe in accordance with public health guidelines.

Members of the Ancaster community have continued to be very generous in their support of ACS, both financially and with volunteering of their time and talents. ACS also promotes collaboration with community partners such as the Ancaster Community Food Drive, the Rotary Club of Ancaster, and religious groups and organizations.

In all of its efforts, the board of directors has worked closely with Executive Director, Lynne Morris. To further support and enhance the governance framework, the board of directors has worked with Lynne to advance an application for accreditation through Imagine Canada. Significant progress was made by filing a preliminary package of documentation to Imagine Canada, which included policies in the areas of finance, governance, fundraising, risk management, and volunteers. The board also updated and modernized its by-laws in the past year.

In addition, the board of directors has worked with Lynne and legal counsel to ensure that the agency achieves compliance with new legislation, the *Ontario Not for Profit Corporations Act, 2010*, which came into force on October 19, 2021. Existing not-for-profit corporations, such as ACS, have three years to bring their governing documents into compliance with the new law, and that process has been started at ACS.

Lynne took on the role of ED on an interim basis. The board of directors wishes to thank Lynne Morris for her exceptional leadership of ACS during this interim period.

The board of directors undertook a recruitment process for a permanent Executive Director and we are delighted to announce that the successful candidate for Executive Director is **Kaylee Norwood**. Kaylee is a recognized community leader in the non-profit sector, has served with ACS as the Manager, Volunteer and Social Services since November 2019 and also as the President of the Hamilton Administrators of Volunteers.

The board of directors looks forward to working with Kaylee in her new role as Executive Director, beginning August 2, 2022. The work of the board of directors in the coming term will include undertaking a survey of the community to inform the strategic planning process.

On behalf of the board of directors, I wish to thank Lynne Morris, ACS staff, and ACS volunteers for their incredible accomplishments in the midst of the challenges of the ongoing pandemic. We look forward to continuing to support their work in the community. The Board of Directors also acknowledges the support for ACS at all levels of government.

WORDS FROM THE EXECUTIVE **DIRECTOR**

As our community experienced another year of changing public health restrictions with the ensuing later pandemic phases, I am very proud of how Ancaster Community Services (ACS) continued to serve the community of Ancaster. ACS supported the community through the various phases of the public health restrictions by adapting guickly with flexible programming which ensured our essential services continued to be delivered to our community. In every operational decision we made to continue our vital service delivery we prioritized the well-being of our clients, volunteers, staff and community.

Our Frozen Meals and Meals on Wheels programs saw combined growth and provided our clients with flexibility for delivery as well as a variety of food choices. The Assisted Volunteer Driving Program remained a flexible program aligning to the ongoing public health restrictions, ramping up and ramping down as the emergency measures dictated. Our Shopping 4 Seniors program, launched at the onset of the pandemic, continued to grow as a critical service to our seniors who were most at-risk.

Depending on the municipal and provincial restrictions in place. our Youth Program led by the Youth Advisory Team, The Net, launched both in-person and virtual events to ensure the continuation of our youth engagement programming. Activities that ranged from wellness and mental health events, leadership forums, job readiness programs, mentorship opportunities, as well as group activities that included online games, trivia and creative projects. During an extremely difficult time with an inability to socialize in-person or learn in classrooms, the Youth Program created an inclusive and welcoming space that enriched and supported its many youth members.

Meeting all the challenges of the past year, both the ACS staff and volunteers continued to deliver on our programs with innovative ideas and unwavering commitment. Incorporating all the public health and safety protocols, the staff and volunteers remained resilient, managed the changes, and delivered the programs and services with compassion, excellence and always a sense of humour.

MEALS ON WHEELS

Our volunteers deliver a hot, nutritious lunch-time meal to seniors who may have difficulty preparing meals and maintaining optimal nutrition.



66 My wife and I attribute receiving the daily meals through the Meals on Wheels program, to our increased nutrition and health. Since starting, our energy levels are higher and we always look forward to seeing the friendly volunteers.

This program helps local seniors stay healthy with fresh and nutritious meals delivered right to their door contact-free. Our meal provider is local caterer, **Set The Table Kitchen & Co.** We have seen steady growth in clients served during the 2021-22 fiscal year. In total, we served **95** unique clients in the Ancaster area this past year and, on average, our volunteers delivered to approximately **29 clients a month.** We have **57** dedicated volunteers for this program who have driven **10,902 KM** to deliver meals.


FROZEN MEALS

Delicious, home-style meals are freshly prepared, frozen at our provider's location and available for pick-up or delivery.

Our Frozen Meals program allows clients to place an order and pick up their meals from our office or have them delivered. Our Frozen Meals provider continues to be **Ina Grafton** in St. Catharines. Clients have the opportunity to select entrées, desserts and soups from a five-week rotational menu.

Frozen Meals has continued to see strong growth throughout the year, as many seniors isolated at home and adhered to the provincial safety guidelines. In total, we served **4,667 meals**. ACS also subsidized **285 meals** for low-income seniors.

EMERGENCY FOOD ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS



FOOD BANK

ACS assisted a total of 1,374 people for all Food Assistance Programs from 502 households accessed throughout the year, compared to 1,243 from 464 in the 2020-21 fiscal year. There was an 8% increase in households served and there was a 79% increase in households requiring delivery.





Providing fresh fruit and vegetables is a priority of our Emergency Food Program. During the year, we utilized our new industrial fridge and freezer in order to store fresh and frozen items such as vegetables, fruit, milk and more.



BUDDY BOX

The Tastebuds' Buddy Box initiative provided nutritious food items to partnering food banks to supplement the items received by families. ACS was provided \$300 per week in fresh produce and dairy products for 40 weeks during this fiscal, starting April 2021 and culminating in March 2022.

ASSISTED VOLUNTEER DRIVING PROGRAM

Providing safe and reliable transportation for local seniors to attend important medical and medical-related appointments.



In 2021-22, we had **56 registered clients** who used this service, and **12 volunteers** who participated in the program. In total, **ACS provided 376 drives** throughout the year to medical and essential appointments in the Hamilton area.

SHOPPING 4 SENIORS

This program empowers local seniors with little to no support to take care of their nutritional health. Seniors can place grocery orders for volunteers to pick up and deliver to their door contact-free. Groceries can be ordered from Food Basics or Longo's Ancaster.

In 2021-2022, we had **60 registered clients** and **8 dedicated volunteers**. In total, our volunteers completed a total of **152 shops** and **drove 848KM**.





FRIENDLY CALLING PROGRAM

Through this service, volunteers called local senior clients 1-2 times every two weeks for a friendly chat while simultaneously performing a wellness check. This program culminated in March 2022 as the need decreased with the lifting of pandemic restrictions. **9 unique clients** were served by **4 volunteers.** In total, **310** calls were made to local seniors.

BENEFITS INCLUDED:

- Decrease in social isolation during the lockdown
- Improving mental health of those who cannot visit family
- Ensuring the health & safety of seniors living alone

The Net Youth Engagement Program has been growing in leaps and bounds since its creation in 2019. Through recent challenges our youth were able to continue to stay connected to one another and find ways to safely contribute to their community. With the support online platforms, youth programs and volunteer opportunities were offered virtually students to allowing community volunteers hours.

Thank you to The Net's Youth Advisory Committee, which seats 20 members, for contributing ideas and leadership from various middle and high schools schools Ancaster and surrounding areas. Each opportunity is designed to teach youth volunteers between the ages of 13-18 about teamwork, advocacy, leadership, mindfulness, volunteering and overall wellness.

Over the past fiscal year The Net partnered with community leaders to create themes around community engagement, life skills, environment, education, physical and mental health. Some of these opportunities included RBC financial literacv workshops. environmental awareness Green Venture and RBG, yoga and meditation sessions with Heron Creek, Free Little Library Book Box with Ancaster Rotary and the Food4Kids mural project.



SUMMER BABYSITTING COURSE 2021

Once again our summer babysitting course was held **virtually** for two week-long sessions in July 2021. Students between the ages of 11-14 learned about important topics such as basic first aid, fire safety, personal safety, water safety and mental health awareness. In total, **33 students** graduated and celebrated becoming certified babysitters!




