BOARD CHAIR STATEMENT



As I reflect on the past year, I am filled with pride and gratitude for the remarkable achievements and steadfast dedication of our community. Ancaster Community Services (ACS) has continued to thrive and expand our impact, focusing on three main program areas supported by strong governance and operational discipline: Senior Supports, Food Security, and Youth Engagement. These pillars are vital to our mission and, on behalf of the entire Board of Directors, I am pleased to share some highlights from the 2023-2024 fiscal year.

Governance: Our commitment to governance and operational excellence remains a top priority, as demonstrated by our continued accredited status with **Imagine Canada's Standards Program**. This accreditation underscores our dedication to accountability and transparency, ensuring we serve our community with the highest standards of integrity.

Food Security: The past year has brought significant challenges, particularly as we responded to an increased need in our food security program. The Ancaster Food Bank saw a 68% increase in income-challenged individuals served, with 46% of those clients being under the age of 18. Additionally, 52% of households utilizing the Ancaster Food Bank were first-time users, citing the increased cost of living as a major factor. These numbers highlight the critical role ACS plays in providing essential support to those in need.

Seniors Supports: Our Senior Supports programs have also seen substantial growth. The Assisted Volunteer Driving Program (AVDP) nearly doubled its services during the past year, marking the highest number of drive requests in the program's history. This increase is largely due to the growing need from our residents in attending medical and professional appointments. With seniors now making up 18% of Hamilton's population, ACS is dedicated to offering quality senior support programs such as *Meals on Wheels, Frozen Meals, AVDP, Shopping 4 Seniors, Santa to a Senior,* and *Birthday Celebrations* to ensure our residents can age successfully in place.

Youth Engagement: Youth has been a vibrant area of focus for ACS. In 2023, we were delighted to see the return of 'The Net' as leaders of the 'Teen Scene' youth programming at the Ancaster Heritage Days. In partnership with Ancaster Heritage Days, Ancaster High, and Bishop Tonnos Student Councils, The Net provided exciting activities like a Dunk Tank, photo booth, and a stage for local youth artists to showcase their talents. During the past year, The Net successfully held 168 events enabling 83 local youth to engage in the community.

Our accomplishments this year would not have been possible without the incredible support of our stakeholders – **donors**, **partners**, **supporters**, and **volunteers**. Your trust and generosity enable us to fulfill our mission and make a tangible difference in the lives of many. We are deeply grateful for your continued commitment to ACS and the Ancaster community.

As ACS looks ahead, we remain dedicated to addressing the evolving needs of our community with compassion and excellence. Together, we can build a brighter future for all residents of Ancaster.

WORDS FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

It has been another tremendous year for Ancaster Community Services (ACS), one focused on growth and collaboration to ensure the successful delivery of our mission. As we celebrate the years accomplishments, I am filled with gratitude for the unfaltering commitment the community has shown the organization in support of our Senior Support, Food Security, and Youth Engagement programs.

Our Assisted Volunteer Driving Program saw significant growth in drives provided, marking a 44% increase compared to the previous fiscal year, making 2023-2024 the busiest year in the program's recorded history. Additionally, the Senior Support programs – Frozen Meals, Meals on Wheels, Shopping 4 Seniors and Santa to a Senior – remained stable and provided our clients with accessible and reliable service.

Our Youth Engagement Program led by the Youth Advisory Team, The Net, maintained both in-person and virtual events to create an inclusive and welcoming space that enriched and supported its many youth members. The Net volunteers led the 'Teen Scene' event with Ancaster Heritage Days in June of 2023, our most highly attended event of the year.

Our Food Assistance Program (Ancaster Food Bank) has seen progressive growth year after year, resulting in a record-breaking number of individuals supported, 68% increase in income-challenged individuals served. ACS is a proud member of the Emergency Food Network and sits on the Emergency Food Strategic Planning Committee which represents the 16 organizations and 23 programs combating food insecurity in the City of Hamilton. As a network, we continue to see first-hand the impact of the skyrocketing costs of living on our community's most vulnerable members and the network is reaching its capacity. ACS remains firm in our commitment to supporting income-challenged families and individuals in our community and has made significant efforts to ensure all those who require assistance receive it.

In line with the remarkable growth seen with the Food Assistance Program, the Holiday Assistance Program served 25% more individuals in December 2023. Through the incredible generosity of our community 128 hampers were provided to local families and 240 children were provided with holiday gifts.

We would not be able to accomplish our important work in the community without the generous donation of time by our outstanding volunteers. I am truly humbled by their selfless dedication to the organization and the clients and community we serve. Our volunteers are essential to the delivery of our mission in Ancaster and, as such, we applaud their efforts.



A heartfelt thank you to the organization's magnificent staff for their enduring commitment to our mission and for remaining steadfast to the values and culture of the agency. You have met all the challenges of the past year with resilience and grace to ensure a continuation of the positive difference in the lives of those we serve.

A sincere thanks to all members of the Ancaster community for your continued support. As our charity is only partly funded by government grants and foundations, we continue to rely on donations from local individuals, businesses, and groups to provide our community services and programs.

The extraordinary generosity of our donors, supporters, and partners allowed us to meet the emerging needs of our community. We are grateful to collaborate with such a passionate group of caring and concerned citizens and we will continue to build on this trust and support to serve our community with purpose and enhance the quality of life for all.

MEALS ON WHEELS

Our volunteers deliver a hot, nutritious lunch-time meal to seniors who may have difficulty preparing meals and maintaining optimal nutrition.

This program helps local seniors stay healthy with fresh and nutritious meals delivered right to their door by friendly volunteers. Our meal provider is local caterer, **Set The Table Kitchen & Co.** We have **52** dedicated volunteers for this program who have contributed **1,170** volunteer hours and driven **7,620 KM** to deliver meals. On average, our volunteers delivered to approximately **22** clients each month.

On behalf of our family, we are so thankful for the ACS Meals on Wheels program. It gives us peace of mind knowing that our parents receive a nutritious hot meal delivered daily. Our parents particularly love to see the volunteer's smiling faces, or as they would call them 'friends'.

FROZEN MEALS


Delicious, home-style meals are freshly prepared, frozen at our provider's location and available for pick-up or delivery.

Our Frozen Meals program allows clients to place an order and pick up their meals from our office or have them delivered. Our Frozen Meals provider continues to be **Ina Grafton** in St. Catharines. Clients have the opportunity to select entrées, desserts, and soups from a five-week rotational menu.

Frozen Meals continues to be a very popular program here at ACS and had **103** unique clients in 2023-24. In total, we served **5,635 meals**. ACS also subsidized **232 meals** for income-challenged seniors. A total of **12** volunteers directly support this program.

FOOD ASSISTANCE PROGRAM



FOOD BANK

ACS assisted a total of **3,554 people** in our Food Bank from **1,093 household visits**. This is a **68%** increase in individuals served and **71%** more food bank visits than the 2022-2023 fiscal year. **46%** of individuals served were children (0-18 years of age), and **63%** of households served have children. **159 new households** visited the Ancaster Food Bank in 2023-2024.




TOTAL INDIVIDUALS SERVED


Comparing the number of individuals served by our Food Bank per month over the past four fiscal years - showing steady access with a noticeable increase for December and another large increase in 2023-24.

COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS

Ancaster Community Services continues to develop and strengthen community partnerships to help support the Ancaster Food Bank. Hamilton Food Share has assisted with ongoing essentials through the *Priority Food Project*. This initiative provides a consistent supply of necessities such as tomato sauce, dried beans, peanut butter, tuna, milk, eggs, and frozen meat. HFS also procured food using the City of Hamilton funding awarded in August 2023 enabling the purchase of food between January and March 2024. Mission Services of Hamilton picks up bulk food allotments from HFS on behalf of ACS. Our volunteers then collect and distribute these items to our Food Bank clients.







Ancaster Food Basics, Ancaster Giant Tiger and Ancaster Longo's assist with regular food donations through a donation bin located on the premises. Ancaster Food Basics also donated 4,140 lbs of meat & fish AND runs monetary promotions for donations throughout the year. DOLLAR TREE collected donations during the holiday season and delivered them to ACS to help fill our Holiday Hampers.



From August-October 2023, the **Green Organic Dutchman** donated fresh produce weekly, enabling us to offer fresh, healthy fruits and vegetables to clients.

Another notable regular donor is **Aspire Bakeries** who provides monthly donations of bread products that ensure all food bank clients receive these products each month.

ACS is grateful for these community partnerships, among others, that help us reach our goal of providing a week's worth of groceries at each food bank visit!



ASSISTED VOLUNTEER DRIVING PROGRAM

Providing safe and reliable transportation for local seniors to attend important medical and medical-related appointments.



In 2023-24, we had **68 registered** clients who used this service, and **18 volunteers** who participated in the program. In total, **ACS provided 634** drives throughout the year to medical and essential appointments.



SHOPPING 4 SENIORS

This program empowers local seniors with little to no support to take care of their nutritional health. Seniors can place grocery orders for volunteers to pick up and deliver to their door. Groceries can be ordered from Food Basics or Longo's in Ancaster.

In 2023-2024, we had **9 registered clients** and **5 dedicated volunteers**. In total, our volunteers completed a total of **117 shops**, contributed **133 hours**, and **drove over 750 KM**.

SENIOR'S BIRTHDAY INITIATIVE

Started under the care of our thoughtful volunteer Cindy, the Senior's Birthday initiative is an added service we provide to our senior clients. Cindy noticed that some seniors were alone on their birthdays, and wanted to ensure everyone felt special on their birthday.

A total of **50 birthday bags** were delivered in 2023-24, and the recipients are always so pleased.

The Net Youth Engagement Program has continued to grow and develop since its launch in 2019. Through the ups and downs of the last few years, our youth were able to stay connected to one another and find ways to contribute to their community in unique ways.

Thank you to The Net's Youth Advisory Team, with 20 members and 2 youth co-chairs, for contributing ideas and leadership from various secondary schools in Ancaster and surrounding areas. Each opportunity is designed to teach youth volunteers between the ages of 13-18 teamwork, advocacy, leadership, kindness, volunteering, and overall wellness.






