

Showing the total number individuals served through our **Food Assistance Program**, highlighting that the need for support continues to increase annually, with 2024-2025 our largest number served thus far.













Since launching in 2019, The Net Youth Engagement Program has grown into a dynamic space for youth leadership and community involvement.


Thank you to The Net's Youth Advisory Team, which seats 12 members, for contributing ideas and leadership from various high schools in Ancaster and surrounding areas. Designed for youth ages 13-18, our initiatives build skills in teamwork, advocacy, leadership, and wellness.

Over the past fiscal year, The Net partnered with community leaders to create programming around community engagement, life skills, environment, education, and physical and mental health.
